Virtual Learning Reminders

Virtual learning is an extension of the in-person classroom. In order to make this a productive experience for the students and teachers, please be mindful of the following:

- ✓ Virtual learners should be online by 7:40 AM, the official start of our school day. The day will end at 11:50 AM. Students will still have specials and a break for snack.
- ✓ Students should be in their school golf shirt or gum t-shirt
- ✓ They should participate in the morning activities in their homeroom.
- ✓ Students should raise their hand to participate just as if they are present in the school building, they should not be calling out. They should also not be eating unless it is snack time.
- ✓ Class participation is key to successful learning. All questions should be asked during the class period. If help is needed with a lesson the student needs to ask the teacher while the lesson is taking place, just like they would if they were in-person,
- ✓ The virtual learner's camera should always be on and facing them while they are seated at a desk or table. He/she should be engaged in the lesson, not looking at other devices or talking with others outside the virtual classroom.
- ✓ The ability to print is key for virtual learners, so please ensure that you have a working printer. This is also specified in the Parent/Student Handbook.
- ✓ If you are having technology issues, call the school office immediately so we can notify the teacher.

Please be sure to review the items listed above with your child. We all want virtual learning to be an effective extension of the in-person classroom. Thank you in advance for your help and cooperation!
